PATROL GRUBMASTER

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Type:** Appointed by the Patrol Leader
- Term:** Duration of Troop outing
- Reports to:** Patrol Leader
- Description:** The patrol Grubmaster is responsible for making sure food is purchased for Troop outings.
- Comments:** The patrol Grubmaster is a very important position for troop outings since the quality of food can make or break a Troop outing.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Age:** none
- Rank:** Scout rank or higher
- Experience:** none
- Attendance:** none

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

- Training:** Receives instruction from the Patrol Leader on how to determine food quantities.
- Attendance:** You are expected to attend the Troop outing for which you are appointed.
- Effort:** You are expected to give this job your best effort.

GENERAL LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

- Uniform:** Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly. This means that you will wear all of the parts of the troop uniform, shirttail tucked in, with all required badges in their correct locations.
- Behavior:** Set the example by living the Scout Oath, Law and Outdoor Code in your everyday life. Show Scout Spirit in everything you say and do.
- Attendance:** Set the example by being an active Scout. Be on-time for meetings and activities. You must call the Senior Patrol Leader or Scoutmaster if you are not going to be at a meeting or if you suddenly have to miss an outing. You also need to make sure that someone will assume your responsibilities.

SPECIFIC LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

- Takes inventory of patrol food before the outing
- Buys food for the troop outing
- Makes sure all patrol scouts are notified of the outing food cost 24 hours before the outing
- Works with Patrol Leader to make sure scouts are assigned to cook the food on outings
